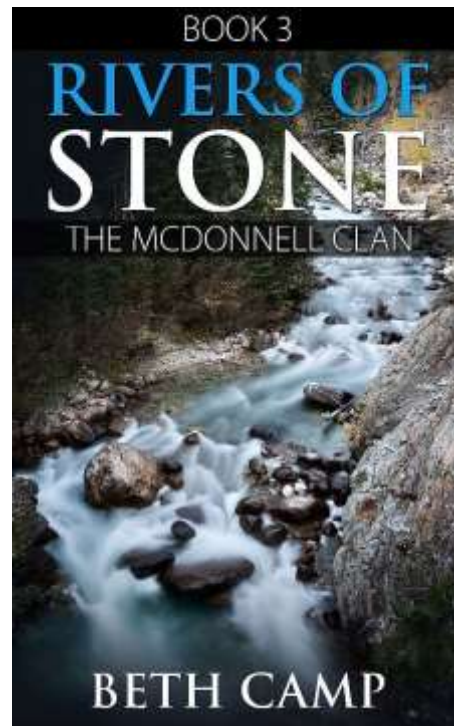


Rivers of Stone
